Student Learner Agreement

The learner agreement is intended to give students a clear understanding of what can be expected from Salisbury 6th Form College and what is expected from them in return.

Under this agreement, S6C will endeavour to provide:

- A curriculum that matches your interests and aspirations and is delivered by suitably qualified members of staff using high quality facilities and resources
- Regular setting and marking of work with constructive feedback on how to improve
- Support in developing good study skills
- A friendly caring and supportive environments in which to study and work
- Regular discussions on your progress with your tutor, providing guidance and assistance in setting targets for improvement
- Impartial advice on careers, employment, welfare, finance, spiritual and pastoral care issues
- Advice and guidance on your personal health and wellbeing including coping with stress
- The opportunity to take part in a varied Enrichment Programme including opportunities for Leadership
- Regular progress reviews and the opportunity for your parents to come into the College to discuss your progress
- A forum for expressing your views and contributing to the development of Salisbury 6th Form College

As a Sixth Form Student at Salisbury 6th Form College you will be expected to:

- Take responsibility for your own learning during lessons and engage fully in all activities by working hard
- Complete all work set to the required standard by the required deadline
- Submit work which is your own original work, clearly presented and as a true reflection of your knowledge understanding and ability
- Have a good attitude to your learning by ensuring good organisation of notes, files and assignments
- Read the relevant course information pages provided and ensure that you understand the syllabus you are studying
- Attend all timetabled activities punctually and explain absence or lateness
- Undertake sufficient private study to maintain progress on your course. This will involve doing your own research to supplement any teaching materials
- Take responsibility for 'catching up' on all missed work due to absence; whether this is class notes or home learning assignments
- Respect the needs of others for quiet around the site and maintain a high standard of tidiness around the College.
- Behave in a sensible and mature manner and look after and respect the Common Room and Work zone
- Show consideration and respect for neighbours of the College whilst moving around the campus and surrounding housing area
- Dress appropriately for the working environment you are in
- Treat everyone with respect and courtesy in the College and follow the S6C Equality statement/policy

- Mobile phones are to be switched off during lessons unless permission to use them as a learning tool has been agreed with the member of staff
- Take responsibility for attending all examinations, both internal and external
- Return all books or materials loaned to you at the completion of your courses
