



ADMISSION ARRANGEMENTS

Introduction

1. Magna Learning Partnership is the admission authority and responsible for the admission arrangements of Salisbury 6th Form College. This document sets out the admission arrangements of Salisbury 6th Form College for study in the academic year 2020/21
2. The College has a total Sixth Form capacity of 400 places in year 12 and 13 combined.
3. The Pupil Admission Number (PAN) for Year 12 is 220. Where there are more candidates than places available, priority for places will be conferred in accordance with the oversubscription criteria set out below.
4. Applications must be completed online by 31st January 2020. Applicants will be invited to attend College to discuss options and the academic requirements for their choices. Details of how to apply are available on the College website.
5. Admission to S6C does not guarantee study of a particular course. An offer of a place will be conditional on the applicant meeting the minimum entry requirements of the College and the entry requirements of each course.
6. Applicants must normally be aged between 16 and 18 on the 31st August 2020. Applications from students outside that age group will be considered according to individual circumstances and the terms of the College's funding agreement with the ESFA; details should be supplied in writing to the Admissions Officer at the College.

Entry Requirements

All students applying to S6C must meet the following general entry requirements;

A minimum of 5 GCSEs at grade 4 or above including English and Maths. Individual subjects may vary.

Oversubscription Criteria

These criteria apply to external students only. Priority will be conferred in the order as follows;

1. Looked after children or previously looked after children
2. All other children

Tie Breaker

If there are not enough places to satisfy all the applications under any one criterion, priority will be given to those living nearest to the college. The College will adopt the measurement system of Wiltshire Local Authority to determine the distance from the College to the home address. Where two or more applicants live an equal distance from the College and it is not possible to differentiate between them, priority will be determined by random allocation through the drawing of lots, supervised by someone independent of the College.

Supplementary Information

The College does not have a religious character.

Appeals for Admission to S6C

Where a student is unsuccessful, a statutory right of appeal lies to an independent admissions appeals panel.

Both the parent and the student have a separate right of appeal. Where both the parent and applicant lodge an appeal, the panel will endeavour to hear the appeals at the same time.
