Try and adapt to a revision routine from early on, even if it is just an hour or two per week to start off, it will really help in the long run!

if you miss a lesson catch up as soon as you can because it will build up

If you procrastinate, maybe don't choose a coursework based subject. If you are really set on picking one try to work on ways to cope before you start.

A-level revision is very different to GCSE revision, you will have to put twice the amount of effort in for 3 A-levels than you did for 8-11 GCSE's.

try not to leave homework until the last minute, do it the day you get it if you can.

If you do a science subject, don't neglect maths skills, you will need them, (for example: percentage increase decrease/ how to rearrange equations)

If you don't understand something, don't leave it till your exams to come back to it.

pick a vocational subject if you can, it means less exams in the second year and less revision

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Never be afraid to ask your teachers for help, no matter how silly you think your question is, they are there to help.

a level subjects are very different to those you do in secondary. english literature is one of the subjects that differs hugely...so make sure to look into the subjects content first.

if you do EPQ- it is worth it, but try and keep your motivation up and get writing as soon as you can, don't spent too long doing your research and make sure you know your topic well

keep your folders organised title each document per topic as well as subtopic so its easier to find during revision, also create a separate document for starters and use for revision

pay attention from day one as you learn content that you may be examined on in the actual exam

don't do a subject just because your friend is doing it, it's important ur happy with ur subjects

decide on a way of note taking before attending lesson so it is all organised and in one place

Don't give up your hobbies because you need to study. You need things in your life to enjoy

at the beginning of the year, go through past exam papers and create a question bank so you have easy access to exam style questions for all of your topics
