Course Description

Psychology is the scientific study of the human mind and behaviour: how we think, feel, act and interact both individually and in groups. In A Level Psychology we learn about each of the approaches to explaining the way your thoughts and feelings act and interact – what makes you, 'you'.

A Level Psychology is designed to give you an introduction to a broad range of topics in the field, and provides the basis for a number of engaging debates on what is at the heart of human nature.

Students studying Psychology at A Level have gone on to study the subject at degree level and see the subject as an ideal stepping stone to this additional study. It also complements other subjects incredibly well; if you're looking at completing a mostly scientific programme, it acts as an excellent addition but equally complements humanities and arts subjects.
