A Level Psychology is designed to give you an introduction to a broad range of topics in the field, from biological influences to the influence of role models, and provides the basis for a number of engaging debates on what is at the heart of human nature.

Students have gone on to study Psychology at degree level, or to pursue a range of other fields including medicine, midwifery, the emergency services and law. Psychology A Level complements other subjects incredibly well; if you're looking at completing a mostly scientific programme, it acts as an excellent addition but equally complements humanities and creative subjects
