Admission Arrangements 2024/2025

A. Introduction

1. Magna Learning Partnership is the admission authority and responsible for the admission arrangements of Salisbury 6th Form College. This document sets out the admission arrangements of Salisbury 6th Form College for the academic year 2024/2025.

2. The College has a Sixth Form with a capacity of 400 places in Year 12 and Year 13.

3. The PAN for Year 12 is 220 which is a minimum number. Where there are more candidates than places available, priority for places will be conferred in accordance with the oversubscription criteria at C below.

4. Applications by must be completed and returned to the College office by 31 January 2024. Applicants may be invited to attend the College to discuss options and the academic requirements for a particular course. Details of how to apply are available on the College website.

5. Admission to the Sixth Form does not guarantee study of a particular course. An offer of a place will be conditional on the applicant meeting the minimum entry requirements in section B.

6. Applicants must normally be 16 on or before 31 August 2024. Applications for students outside that age group will be considered according to the individual circumstances of the case; details should be supplied in writing to the Admissions Department at the College.

B. <u>Entry Requirements</u>

At S6C, you can follow three advanced level pathways:

1: <u>Academic Pathway</u> – three/four A levels plus the option to study the Extended Project Qualification (EPQ).

2: <u>Mixed Pathway</u> – you can combine BTEC National and CTEC Technical options (single or double A level equivalent) with one or more A levels. EPQ is also an option.

3: <u>Extended Diploma</u> – we also offer a full time extended diploma in Business, Health and Social Care and one in Applied Science. These courses have been carefully selected because

there are excellent progression opportunities within the Health Service and the local business community.

All students choosing to study at S6C must meet the general entry requirements as well as the specific entry requirements for their chosen subjects (as detailed in the subject descriptions):

<u>Pathway 1:</u> Students following a purely Academic Curriculum (three/four A levels): you must achieve a minimum of 6 GCSE passes at grade 5 or above including at least a grade 5 in GCSE English Language plus at least a grade 5 in Maths.

<u>Pathway 2:</u> Students following a mixed pathway: you must achieve a minimum of 5 GCSE passes at grade 4 or above including at least a grade 4 in GCSE English Language plus at least a grade 4 in Maths.

<u>Pathway 3:</u> For students studying an extended diploma, please see the subject pages for the entry criteria.

In addition, we offer an Accelerated Pathway, in Business or Health and Social Care.

In this pathway, students study the level 2 Certificate up until Easter of year 1, before progressing to the level 3 Diploma for the remainder of the 2 years. These courses include the retakes of English and Maths GCSEs to as appropriate.

For this pathway, students need to have a minimum of 5 grade 3s at GCSE

C. Oversubscription Criteria

These criteria applies to external pupils only. Priority will be conferred in the order as follows:

- (i) Looked After Children or Previously Looked After Children
- (ii) <u>All other children</u>

<u>Tie Breaker</u>

If there are not enough places to satisfy all the applications under any one criterion, priority will be given to those living nearest the College. The College will adopt the measurement system of Wiltshire Local Authority to determine the distance from the College to the Home address. Where two or more applicants live an equal distance from the College and it is not possible to differentiate between them, priority will be determined by random allocation through the drawing of lots supervised by someone independent of the College.

D. Supplementary Information Form (SIF)

The College does not use a SIF.

E. Appeals for Sixth Form Admissions

1. Where an applicant is unsuccessful a statutory right of appeal lies to an independent admission appeals panel.

2. Both the parent and the pupil have a separate right of appeal. Where both the parent and applicant lodge an appeal, the panel will endeavour to hear the appeals at the same time.
